SA's top little titans go for goal

Young soccer talent will come forward in under-12 Danone Nations Cup finals

HE NATIONAL finals of the under-12 Danone Nations L Cup competition take place at Reiger Park today.

The nine provincial champion schools have emerged from a process that began in April and involved more than 400 schools in the early stages.

The winners of today's playoff tournament will represent South Africa at the world finals of the competition in London in

The last of the provincial playoffs took place last weekend, also in Reiger Park, and Kgomoco Primary School, from Sharpeville in the Sedibeng district, walked off with the Gauteng title.

They beat Johannesburg's Basa Tutorial College 2-0 in the final to clinch the title, and with it the right to return to the same venue today to meet the other eight provincial champions in the competition for the national title.

Their goals were scored by Mafole Mofokeng and Sfiso Motaung

It was cold and blustery in Reiger Park on Saturday, but that did nothing to dampen the enthusiasm of the eight teams in action.

There was some excellent football played and a feature of the day was the fact that there were regulation-time results in all but two of the 15-minute games played.

 Kgomoco's key midfielder Romeo Gawu will miss today's action due to a foot injury he sustained last weekend, writes Mbongiseni Buthelezi.

Kgomoco team manager Teboho Shale says the team will, however, be ready for the games over the weekend. They have been working hard at training this week for the national tournament.

"We will be looking for a replacement for Gawu from within the team," he says. Gawu was injured playing for his Sharpeville local club team over the weekend. "We will not be looking outside

of the squad for a replacement. "In this competition you are al-

lowed only 10 players on the field, including the goalkeeper, so we have enough players in the squad. "We will, however, miss Romeo as he is our most effective attack-

ing midfielder." Sahle says they will be relying qualification of two of the team on their goalkeeper, Katleho Mofokeng, to see them through to the next stage.

"He has been the key in our qualifying matches," he says. 'Many of our games were decided on penalties and he has stopped a number of those.

"We will also be turning to Sabata Radebe, our captain and midfielder."

Shale says they are pleased the tournament is in Boksburg.

"It's home ground advantage for us, and we will be busing in our supporters from the school to support the team on the day."
